

Grain Trade Australia Pulse Standards 2024/25 Season Addendum

1. Purpose

To outline transcription errors in the Pulse Standards 2024/25 published on the GTA website as of 1 August 2024 following re-formatting from the previous season.

The following errors were administrative only, and did not impact on the intent of the Standards.

The revised document was re-published on the GTA website 26 November 2024.

2. Administrative Changes made

- CSP 4.2 Chickpeas – Split Chana Dhal Minimum Export Standard – page 40
 - Issue: The “1 #” next to parameter “*of which Severely Damaged Maximum (% by weight per 200 gram) Mould, Burnt & Heat Damaged or Other Serious Visual Defects*” indicates that Severely Damaged is included in Total Defective. There is not a Total Defective parameter for chana dhal. Severely Damaged is included in “Whole Chickpeas with a missing seed coat”.
 - Solution: In the total 2% by weight of Whole chickpeas with a missing seed coat, remove the reference to # indicating included in Total Defective and replace with “Whole chickpeas with a missing seed coat”.
- CSP 5.5 Split Faba Beans – No.1 Split Minimum Export Standard Machine Dressed – page 54
 - Issue: “*of which Caps and Faba Beans with Seed Coat Intact (Max % by weight) Caps are seed coats adhering to split or broken seed*” – was missing a tolerance value in the right-hand column.
 - Solution: added the tolerance of “2” % by weight.
- CSP 7.4.1 Lentils – Split Red No. 1 Grade Minimum Export Standard – page 66
 - Issue: There is no Total Defective limit and hence the reference to “# Severely Damaged included in Total Defective” is incorrect.
 - Solution: Severely Damaged is 1% by weight, stand-alone, and there is now no “#” after it.
- CSP 12.2 Vetch – Minimum Export Standard Machine Dressed – page 87
 - Issue: Foreign Material referred to “*includes 2% by weight Cereal Grains*”. However, the limit for Foreign Material is only 0.5%.
 - Solution: Remove the reference to “Foreign Material includes 2% by weight Cereal Grains”.
