4 GTA Technical Committees – General Information

GTA Technical Committees are **skills-based** appointments.

The GTA Board will appoint members based on the applicant's technical competency within the Technical Committee's scope whilst mindful that the Committee should, where possible, have representation from:

- All sectors of the grain supply chain, affected by the decisions of the committee;
- Large and small organisations; and
- All major grain production and trading states.

The scope of each of the Technical Committee can be found at Item 8 below.

The GTA Board relies on the Technical Committee's to consider these and other subsequent issues that may have a potential impact on GTA services to Members, and to advise the Board on appropriate action. Therefore, all nominees should be confident to openly discuss and provide input toward decisions.

GTA Technical Committees meet 4-8 times per year via teleconference. Some Committees may hold in-person meetings during the year (eg: Trading Standards).

Members are responsible for their own telephone call and any travel costs.

GTA Technical Committee Members agree to participate on a Committee for the benefit of all GTA Members. **They do not** represent the interests of any one industry sector, private or public organisation.
