Explanatory Memorandum Annual General Meeting 2025

1. Introduction

This Explanatory Memorandum is provided to members of Grain Trade Australia Limited ACN 097 228 656 ("Company" or "GTA") to explain the resolutions to be put to members at the Annual General Meeting ("AGM") to be held on 28 October 2025 (in Sydney at Clifftons, Level 13, 60 Margaret Street, Sydney and via Zoom) commencing at 9:30 am AEDT.

The Directors recommend members read the accompanying Notice of Meeting and this Explanatory Memorandum in full before making any decision in relation to the resolutions.

The Directors recommends you vote in favour of all resolutions. Other than in respect of the ballot, the Chair of the meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of all resolutions.

The Chair intends to abstain from voting, in respect of the ballot, except in the event of a tied result where the Chair will cast the deciding vote.

It is important that members cast their own votes.

2. Consider the Company's Annual Report

The Corporations Act requires the financial report, the directors' report and the auditor's report to be laid before the AGM. There is no requirement either in the Corporations Act or in the Constitution of the Company for members to approve the financial report, the directors' report or the auditor's report. The Company's financial reports are to be placed before the members. Members will have a reasonable opportunity at the meeting to ask questions and make comments on these reports and on the business, operations and management of the Company. No voting is required for this item.

The financial report, the directors' report and the auditor's report are available on the GTA website.

3. <u>Resolution 1</u> – Election of Andy Cunliffe as a Director (Nominated by an Ordinary Level B Member)

Ordinary Resolution 1 seeks member approval for the election of Andy Cunliffe as a Director of the Company.

It is proposed that Andy Cunliffe be appointed to the Board as one of the two directors who can be nominated by Ordinary Level B Member in accordance with Rule 3.3 of the constitution.

Andy Cunliffe has been nominated by KM & WM Kelly & Sons, Ridley Agriproducts and ETG Commodities, all three being Ordinary Level B Members.
